### **FACILITIES OFFERED: (Art. 132, 133)**

#### **A) Official Teams and foreign individual riders**

The OC will provide free hotel accommodation (in single rooms, bed and breakfast accommodation) to Chefs d'Equipe and competing riders from 12.00 a.m. on 26<sup>th</sup> to 12.00 a.m. on 31<sup>st</sup> May 2004.

Additional expenses: All additional expenses (bar, telephone, tips, supplementary breakfast, etc) and the eventual cost of the difference between the single bedroom accommodation and other kind of accommodation are at competitor's or chef d'équipe's charge.

The NFs are asked to send to the OC, deadline 17<sup>th</sup> May 2004, the hotel reservation list for riders and chef d'équipe with a correct specification of the single and double rooms. They will be held responsible for any of their riders who changes reservation on arrival at the hotel

Chefs d'Equipe and competitors will receive allowances for a total of Euro 100 (lump sum for travel expenses) provided by the OC, and lunch and dinner vouchers (4 days).

### **B) Home individual riders:**

- no allowances for hotel and transport expenses. Hotel reservation is at their own charge. They will receive 4 lunch and dinner vouchers free of charge.

### **C) Grooms**

Grooms will find free accommodation close to the stables under request made before the 18<sup>th</sup> May 2004 specifying the names of grooms. **No reservation for accommodation will be made for grooms if the OC is not informed by this date.**

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

Every groom will receive a lump sum of € 130 for lunch and dinner for the whole duration of the event (from Wednesday till Sunday)

### **D) Horses**

The OC will contribute to transport expenses for horses of foreign teams and foreign individual riders at a fixed rate of Euro 50 per horse, with the exception of the horses entered for Puissance only.

**NO ALLOWANCES FOR HORSES OF HOME TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL RIDERS.**

Stabling arrangements from 25<sup>th</sup> May to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2004.

Horses of Official Teams will be provided with bedding (straw) for the whole duration of the event free of charge.

Horses of individual riders will be provided with initial bedding (straw) only.

Any other form of bedding than straw and fodder will be delivered on special request with definite entries and can be purchased from the Stable Manager from 8 a.m. until 11.00 a.m. with payment in advance.

Horses may not leave their boxes without the official Show starting number, or leave the stable area under the Stewards control without their permission.

### **E) Welcome**

ARRIVAL TIME: from 8.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m..

The horses are authorised to enter the CSIO stables in Villa Borghese from 24<sup>th</sup> May 2004 and must not be unloaded without the authorization of the Stable Manager. The boxes will be assigned on arrival at the stables. A fine of Euro 50 will be paid for the wrong occupation of a box

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport, together with the number and dimensions of the lorries, must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival.

## **F) Local Transportation - Arrangements from Hotel to Showgrounds**

The OC will provide Officials, Chefs d'équipe and competitors with a shuttle service to /from the hotels and show ground.

## **G) Advertising and Publicity on Competitors and Horses (Art. 136)**

The competitors **are authorised** to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.

The Chief Steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI Regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by riders before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted to enter the arena during the competition.

### **APPROVED LABORATORY - (Art. 1022)**

Under the Medication Control Programme (MCP) in **Groups I and II**, all samples collected in accordance with VR Art. 1016 & 1018 will be analysed by the ***LCH Laboratoire des Courses Hippiques, 15 rue de Paradis, F-91370 Verrieres le Buisson***. For events other than those listed in VR Art. 1016 or for events other than in Groups I and II, samples may be analysed at an alternative approved Laboratory (VR Art. 1021).

## VIII MISCELLANEOUS

### 1) OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS - (Art. 167, 168, 170 & 171)

All complaints and objections to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

### 2) DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES - (Art. 130)

Prize money will be distributed at the Show Office on Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May 2004 half an hour after the end of competition No 10 for competitions No 1-10. The Grand Prix's prize money will be paid half an hour after the end of its prize giving ceremony.

### 3) PRIZE GIVING CEREMONIES

At the end of each competition, the first eight competitors shall enter the main arena for the presentations, riding the horse on which they competed (Art. 248.4). The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize-giving ceremony of the Grand Prix.

### 4) DOCTOR, VETERINARIAN, FARRIER

Medical and veterinary assistance as well as farriery services will be provided by the OC for all duration of the Show near the main arena. Veterinary assistance as well as farriery services will also be provided at the stables. These services will be charged to the owners/competitors.

### 5) INSURANCES

The OC declines all responsibilities for material and physical damage, accidents or illness suffered by owners, Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, grooms and horses in any circumstances, inside or outside the Show area, during or after the competitions.

Therefore all participants shall check that their personal insurances are valid:

- for their sporting activity
- for the country in which this activity takes place.

Damage to cars, lorries, harness, saddlery, stable equipment and other properties, including theft and loss, as well as damages to the stables or the grooms' caravans will not be covered by the OC Insurance Policies.

"All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."

### 6) EVENT'S ORGANISATION - (Art. 115.2)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify

any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

## **7) ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133)**

The OC will provide the Chefs d'Equipe, competitors and their partners, 2 owners per horse and 1 groom per competitor with the necessary accreditation

## **8) DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY**

According to the Italian law, 20% of the total prize money for riders will be deducted at source by the OC for Government taxes.

## **9) SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS**

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

## **10) OFFICIALS AND RIDERS MEETING**

The meeting for Officials, Chefs d'Equipe and individual riders will take place on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2004 at 6.00 p.m. at the Show Office in Piazza di Siena.

## **11) DECLARATION OF STARTERS**

For classes No 1, 2 and 3, the declarations must be handed in no later than half an hour after the end of the technical meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> May.

Chefs d'Equipe must hand in the declarations for the following day's classes to the Show Office half an hour after the end of the **last competition** the day before.

On Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> May half an hour after the end of competition No 3 at the latest, Chefs d'Equipe must give in writing the names of riders and horses for the Nations' Cup to the Show Office.

The name of the owner of each horse will be added to all start lists and results Sheets.

## **12) DRAW**

**Nations' Cup and Grand Prix:** it will be held on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> May – Chefs d'Equipe will be informed during the technical meeting about the time of the draw.

## **13) DRESS**

Competitors are required to wear correct dress when inspecting the course (including riding boots).

## **THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**

### **FOR**

## **THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
  2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
  3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
  4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
  5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
